Martin F. Manalansan IV is an Associate Professor of Anthropology and American Studies at the University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign. He has edited two important collections and authored the book *Global Divas: Filipino Gay Men in the Diaspora* (Duke University Press, 2003).

Elizabeth A. Povinelli is a Professor of Anthropology and Gender Studies at Columbia University where she also directs the Institute for Research on Women and Gender. Her research is focused on developing a critical theory of late liberalism. She has published several books, most recently *The Empire of Love: Toward a Theory of Intimacy, Genealogy, and Carnality* (Duke University Press, 2006).
